When to Lead Trumps as Defender (2)

(Continued from yesterday's Bulletin)

2) If the Opponents Are Overbidding (or Sacrificing)

If our side has the majority of the high cards and the opponents outbid us, it's likely that the only way they can make their contract is by using the trump suit to ruff our high cards. This often occurs when the opponents decide to take a sacrifice against us. Leading a trump will often get us an extra trick or two.

♠ J 10
♥ A K J 5
♦ 8 4
♣ K J 10 8 3

We hold this hand as West, on lead against five diamonds doubled after this auction:

West	North	East	South
—	—	1 ♠	3 ♦
Double	5 ♦	Pass	Pass
Double	Pass	Pass	Pass

When partner opens the bidding, we know we have enough combined strength to go for a game contract; we just aren't sure WHERE. After South's preemptive jump overcall to three diamonds, we make a negative—takeout—double. North makes a preemptive raise to five diamonds, to make things more difficult for our side. When the bidding comes back to us, we make a penalty double.

It's doubtful North-South can take eleven tricks! Where are the opponents going to get their tricks? Partner presumably has high cards in spades and we have high cards in hearts and clubs. Their only source of tricks is likely to be diamonds. Time to lead a trump and reduce their trick-taking potential. Here's the complete deal:

♠ 7 6 5 4 3

We lead a diamond and declarer can win and play the ace of clubs and ruff a club in dummy. If declarer leads a heart, we win and lead another trump, removing dummy's last diamond. If declarer leads a spade, partner wins and can lead a heart so that we can win and lead another diamond. On this defence, we defeat five diamonds two tricks. Declarer has to lose a spade, a heart, and two clubs. The penalty will compensate us for being outbid. We might have made four hearts; but we might have been defeated in that contract if North got two club ruffs to go with the aces of diamonds and clubs.

If we had led either a heart or a spade and then switched to a trump, we would only defeat the five-diamond contract one trick. Declarer would get two club ruffs in dummy. Worse, if we led the ace-king of hearts, declarer could make the contract by ruffing three clubs in dummy, using heart ruffs to get back to the South hand each time.

3) If Partner Passes a Low-Level Takeout Double

If we make a takeout double and partner passes, partner has converted our double into a penalty double. This implies that partner has length and strength in their trump suit. As in the previous situation, we should usually lead a trump to protect our side's high cards in the other suits.

♠ K 10 6 2
 ♥ K Q 10 8
 ♦ K Q J 10
 ♣ 2

As West, we are on lead with this hand after the auction has unexpectedly gone:

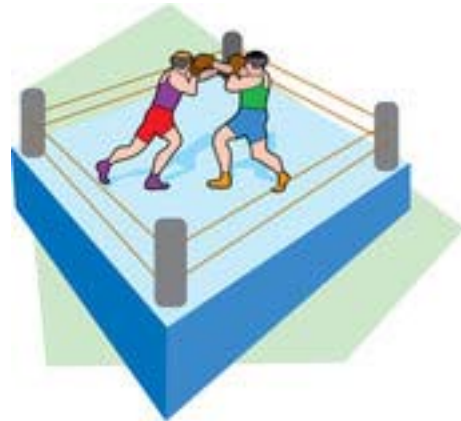

It's usually a poor idea to lead a singleton trump but this auction demands a trump lead. To defeat one club doubled, we have to take seven tricks with clubs as trumps. In effect, we must make one club! As declarer, we'd usually draw trumps as quickly as possible, and it's no different here. Partner must have an excellent holding in clubs, so we should lead the two of clubs rather than the more tempting king of diamonds. Here's the full deal:

A club lead restricts declarer to four tricks...his three aces and the club king. Partner will drive out the ace and king of clubs and draw declarer's remaining trumps. If we led a diamond, declarer would win and play the ace of hearts and another heart. Declarer then gets two more tricks by ruffing a heart in dummy and a diamond in the South hand. So, we should occasionally lead trumps—but only when we have no doubt it is the right lead!

Panel Show



The following hand came up for spirited discussion at Tuesday Morning's Panel Show with David Ezekiel and Allan Graves:

Dealer West. EW Vul.

You, West, hold:

♠ 4 2
 ♥ A 6
 ♦ 5
 ♣ K Q J 10 9 6 3 2

What would be your call as dealer?

These were the results of a poll taken at the panel show:

With very distributional hands, there is no right or wrong in deciding whether to open at a low or high level, or pass to garner information. On this hand, the advantages and disadvantages are:

Pass: means you are taking over sole decision-making power for the partnership. While it allows the opponents to get together at a low level, it also gives you the opportunity to listen (or see!) their auction before making your own decision about whether to bid or not.

1 ♣: if the hand belongs to you, this will allow you to have a cooperative auction with partner. On the other hand, there is nothing to prevent the opponents getting their act together to discover their best contract, or to mess up your auction.

3 ♣: is the worst of both worlds. The bid is not high enough to impede the opponents, and with your heart ace, misdescribes your defensive prospects to partner.

4 ♣: puts a certain amount of pressure on the opponents, but if the hand belongs to you, goes past one of your possible games, three no trump. At the prevailing vulnerability (vul. vs. not), this is probably the 'book' bid.

5 ♣: although none of the audience made this bid, it is worth considering.

What was the whole deal?

As you can see, your side can make three no trump. Unfortunately, your opponents can make four hearts, so they are unlikely to let you play there. The only bid which will shut out North-South is five clubs, which can be set one trick. If you did decide to pass to await developments, it is remotely possible the opponents will not get to game.

The Hog's Part in Bermuda's Rich History and Heritage

Bermuda is known to have been populated by wild hogs when Henry May and the company of the Sea Venture were wrecked here. One writer says the 140 Sea Venture survivors dined on them for nine months, and didn't seem to make much of a dent in their number. Perhaps in thanks, the first coins issued in Bermuda were called Hog Money. On the obverse face were a wild boar and the words Sommer Islands, and on the reverse, a ship under sail, with the Cross of St George at each masthead. The hog on the current Bermuda Penny is a reproduction of the one originally depicted on Bermuda's first coinage.



Bermuda's Unique Architecture

Pastel Bermuda cottages are often regarded as a hallmark of the island, along with pink beaches and Bermuda shorts; the style has even been described as the country's only indigenous art form.

In addition to the local style, historical military buildings and forts and modern office buildings are highly visible. The historical architecture of Bermuda has received recognition



from UNESCO, with the Town of St. George and some twenty-two forts and military facilities in St. George's Parish being declared World Heritage Sites.

The archetypical Bermuda house is a low, squared building with a stepped, white roof and pastel-painted walls, both of which are made out of stone. The buildings were originally quite plain, due to the brittleness of limestone and lingering Puritanical asceticism. Only two means of decor have been observed in seventeenth century buildings: "Eyebrow Windows" and gable-ends. Between roof and wall are a series of eaves painted a third colour, which is also used on the wooden shutters of relatively small windows. Often built on a slope, there is a set of stairs, wider at the base than at the top, leading up to a porch or verandah around the front door. Rare embellishments include a brick pattern down the corners of the building, and narrow moulding to highlight features such as windows.

Bermuda houses must be white roofed and painted in pastel hues, with paint and sealer approved by the Chief Medical Officer of the Bermuda Government, although there are a few exceptions. The rooves are designed to catch water, of which there is no fresh supply in Bermuda apart from rain. The walls are designed to restrict damage from hurricanes and are required by law to be able to withstand wind speeds of over 100 mph. Houses are often given names.

PAIRS DEALS

Keep Your Cool

Ed White reported this deal from the first session of the Championship Pairs. It is a lesson in maintaining your cool and never giving up, both for the declarer and the defenders.

Board 13. Dealer North. Both Vul.

East decided to lead the diamond ace to have a look at the dummy. Bert Newman ruffed that and, with clubs looking to provide all the tricks he needed, started on trumps by leading the king. West gave that a long look, but finally won the ace – East's showing out was a bit of a blow, but Newman is, after all, a cool customer.

West continued with the heart jack to cut down the ruffs in dummy – he could see that declarer would not be able to use the clubs for much. Newman won the heart queen and played the queen of diamonds, covered and ruffed with the eight of hearts. When Newman then played three top clubs, West ruffed with the seven of hearts. This was the position (see *top of next column*).

At this point West is fixed. No matter which card he plays, declarer has the rest of the tricks.

A spade or diamond is won in hand to cash a winner in the other suit in hand. Then a spade to the ace and the jack of clubs is played. If West discards, so does North – then West is trump couped. If West ruffs the club jack, declarer over-ruffs, draws the other trump, and has a good diamond at the end.

The lesson is...keep your head and don't panic when a bad split happens.

...with a Little Help from My Friends

Dode Walker played this hand very well against my partner and me yesterday in the afternoon pairs game:

West opened one no trump in second seat, and North's

two-heart overcall ended the proceedings. I started out with a fourth-best deuce of clubs. We played three round of clubs, North ruffing. Dode then played a diamond to the ace on the board and a heart to the ten. When this held, she played a spade to the ace and another heart to the jack. When I showed out, she led another spade to the eight and partner's jack. He exited with his last club, ruffed by declarer. Her work was now almost done - the position was

Dode cashed the king of diamonds and exited with her losing diamond. I won with the jack (partner pitching his last spade) and folded my cards with a "well played."

Do you see where we could do better? We did declarer's work for her in shortening her trumps to the same length as West's. If West exits the queen of diamonds rather than his last club the end-play won't work.

Well done to Dode Walker for letting us help her along to a very nice plus 140!

Allan Graves mentioned more than once in the Panel Show that declarer often does well to try to conceal his high cards and distribution from the defenders. Little did he know that this sage advice would come back to haunt him that very evening! Even worse, it was teammates Bill Souster and Joe Wakefield who did Jean Johnson and Allan in. The deal occurred in the second session of the Championship Pairs – it was the first board of the session for these combatants.

Jean Johnson led the two of diamonds and Souster won the jack, crossed on a heart and played a spade to the queen and king. When Johnson continued diamonds, Souster cashed the ace of spades and ran his red cards, discarding a spade from hand. This was the ending:

When the heart four was played from dummy, Graves believed he had to keep the jack third of clubs to stop the run of the suit – declarer was pretty much marked with the ace-king for accepting the invitation – so he discarded the spade jack. Johnson also believed she had to keep a club guard as well, so she threw the spade nine. Oops.

Souster's six of spades took trick thirteen. Concealing the four-card spade suit in the bidding had helped Souster win the slam-going trick.
