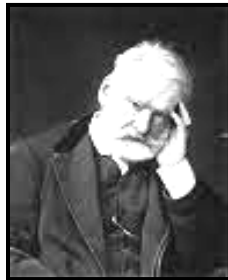

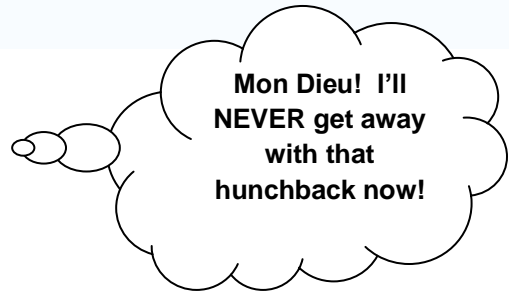
LOCAL LORE/BERMUDA BITS (RE-RUN from 2011)

LOCAL LORE/BERMUDA BITS (NEW for 2012)

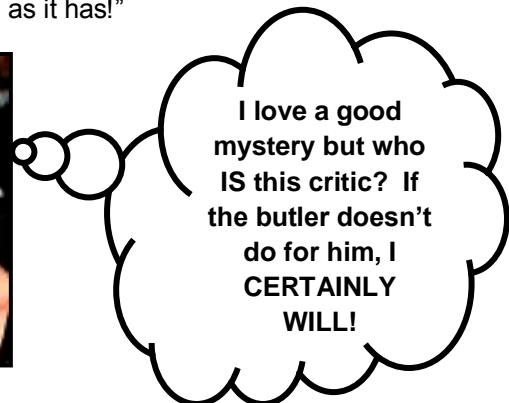
If "Les Mis" is the longest running **musical** in the West End, the longest running **production of them all** is Agatha Christie's "**The Mousetrap**" which, this November, will celebrate its 60th anniversary. In August of last year, Englishman Clive Payne from the the Cotswolds, England made a unique discovery while restoring an old bureau; removing the back from the furniture, he discovered a telegram sent **from Bermuda in 1957** by **Noel Coward** (who then lived here) reluctantly congratulating Agatha Christie on breaking the record for the longest running play in the West End with "The Mousetrap", an honour previously held by his own "**Blithe Spirit**".

The telegram reads: "Dear Agatha Christie. Much as it pains me, I really must congratulate you on The Mousetrap breaking the long run record. All my good wishes – Noel Coward"

Today's hand is from the A/X Swiss. Let's start with a discussion of an interesting auction at our teammates' table before we consider the excitement at our own...

The South Player, Ed White, got to use a nifty gadget and opened 3N – showing at least 6-5 in the minors. West, Paddy Herlihy, had no agreements against such a convention (not your everyday opening bid) and so did well to Double – value showing (and for the Majors, she hoped?) North, Bert Newman, now jumped to 6♣, feeling certain that he was going to make that (and I would be too!) That is when West, Theri Andino, came to life. She came in with 6♥! After the ♦K lead 6♥ was down three doubled for -500 (certainly better than the -920 that was likely to come if she had passed.) This was a fine result by our teammates.

At our table my partner (South) opened 3♦?!? and John Burville now overcalled 3♠. I was certain that I was beating 3♠, so I doubled. This passed around to John and he judged well to run to 4♥. I felt obligated to Double that as well (suspecting that we would beat that...) Unfortunately, I could not lead a ♦ and in my effort to beat the contract (I needed my partner to have the ♦A) the opponent's made 5, -690!

Our team played well most of the day, but on this board we did not manage to come out on top!

Auction Analysis:

After North's 1H opener, South has quite a good hand but doesn't have the correct shape for a takeout double, overcalling a bad 5 card suit even with an opening hand is a bad idea. Having eliminated Double and 2C, the only remaining options are Pass and 1S. Starting with Pass could work, but we'd like a spade lead, and this suit certainly looks like a 5 card suit. All in all, it seems that 1S is the best of several suboptimal choices.

Play Notes:

After a fourth best heart lead from West, the main problem on this deal is to establish the club suit before losing control of the hand via taps from the opponents. East wins the heart with the Ace, and returns a small spade. What's your plan?

Depending on the club split, we may or may not be able to afford losing a spade trick. The first order of business on this hand should be to test the club suit. There aren't dangers of ruffs in the club suit, since if the opponents do ruff a club, it will be a loser anyway. Win the ace of spades, and play the CA and the CT, taking care to not block the club suit. When West wins the Queen of clubs, they can return a heart to the Queen, King and a ruff, tapping dummy. Now we can play another club establishing the remaining clubs as winners, and then focus on drawing trump. East will win the CJ and play another trump, forcing a guess immediately. Can we figure out where the Queen of trumps is?

On the second round of hearts, notice that West played the HK. A quick count of East's High-Card-Points will reveal 4 (or 5) in Hearts and 3 in clubs. In order to come to an opening bid, they almost certainly hold the Queen of Diamonds and the Queen of Spades, making it a favourite to finesse the Ten. At the table the deal was slightly different, and I followed a similar line of play to come to 10 tricks.
