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BERMUDAWISE: THE BIRDS AND THE TREES

Welded to those bridge tables all day and most of the night in that stark artificial ballroom light, many of you may never get the opportunity to sample any of Bermuda's natural beauty so we're bringing some of it to you.

Bermuda's national bird and its avian jewel in the crown is the Cahow or Petrel, the Island's only endemic bird. Although believed extinct for 330 years, in a dramatic development early in the 20th century, 18 pairs of Cahows were unexpectedly discovered surviving on isolated islands in Castle Harbour at Bermuda's east end. Following this find, the Bermuda Government designated the nesting islets as sanctuaries, and local scientist David Wingate made it his life's work to protect and cultivate this colony, as a result of which this "Lazarus Species" has significantly increased in number, now flourishes in peace on Nonsuch Island, and has been further immortalised on the Bermudian \$10 bill.



Unlike the Cahow, the Bermuda Longtail is not endemic to Bermuda but has certainly become the Island's scene-stealing show-stopper and is the widely-anticipated harbinger of Spring. These annual visitors arrive after spending the winter at sea on the open ocean and nest with mates with whom they are paired for life. They raise a single chick during the summer months and then the family leaves again in the fall. Abundant on the Southern shore of the island in summer, they are certainly among the most graceful and elegant of Bermuda's natural attractions and are instantly recognisable because they have - er - long tails.

We have named one of our most prestigious bridge trophies after this winged wonder (see yesterday's bulletin) because the winner of the award flies to the Island for a short while, soars to sensational heights, leaves an indelible impression, and then flies away again until, hopefully, the following year.

So, not just one high-flying national treasure, but two
- two for joy.

At one time, the Bermuda cedar tree was the dominant endemic tree of these islands and formed woodland that covered much of the land; however, scale insects, accidentally introduced from the US mainland during World War II, devastated the forests, killing over 99% of the Bermuda cedar. Since then, the salt-tolerant Casuarina has been planted as a replacement species, although a small number of Bermuda cedars still survive having developed resistance to the insects which destroyed the others.

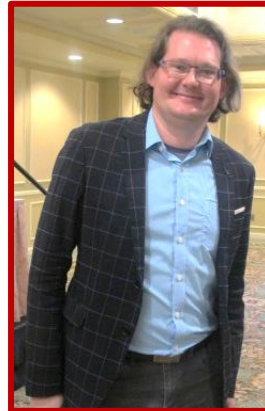

ROBERT'S RULES on SLAM BIDDING



Yesterday, a record number of 70 + eager students gathered for the first of the expert lectures from Robert Todd.

Hot Toddy's topic was "slam bidding" and his main tip was to be prepared to constantly re-evaluate the value of your own hand as you proceed through the bidding towards slam and learn more about what others hold in their hands.



Standing Room Only!

In his own inimitable way of simplifying the most complex of concepts, he emphasized the importance of evaluating your cards in relation to the position of other cards in the deal; for example, honours opposite shortness is bad while honours opposite length is good.

Or, as he put it, "When valuing your hand, your prime consideration should be the Real Estate of Bridge - location, location, location!"

The atmosphere was abuzz with the excitement of learning and Robert responded with equal enthusiasm. Hot Toddy? He fairly SIZZLED! Robert definitely ruled yesterday lunchtime!

 **PROFIT FROM THE PROPHET** 

Once aspect of declarer play that is usually missing from the arsenal of the Intermediate player is the ability to spot when to give the defence the tricks that are unavoidably theirs, in order to enlist their help in making the contract at hand. Many suits will only yield a trick if started by the opposition and it is up to declarer to force that position.

Before getting to the hand, it is important for players to understand the ‘ruff and discard’ play, where the defender leads a suit of which there are none with declarer or dummy but both of whom have at least one trump. This allows declarer to ruff in one hand and discard a loser from the other, and is a play the defence will do everything to avoid.

With all that in mind plan, what is your play on the hand below left – you are in 4 Spades and West leads a small heart?

Dealer North
Both Vul

You win the King and take stock – you have no losers in the majors, you have a certain loser in clubs and at least two losers in diamonds, perhaps three – how do you turn the ‘perhaps three’ into ‘not three!?’

You have some preparation to do as you want to force the opponents to lead diamonds and as a result you must eliminate as many other suits that they can play safely. So, you win the heart, draw trumps, cash the other heart (a key play) and now give the opponents their club trick by playing Ace – King and a third club, arriving at the position below:

The defence now has the lead and is left with Hobson’s Choice – either to open up the diamonds which guarantees declarer a diamond trick, or to lead a heart giving declarer the chance to ruff in one hand and discard a diamond from the other, again limiting the diamond losers to two. Contract made!

Look upon this play and take heed for it will present itself many times in your bridge in the days to come.
And here endeth the lesson.

Minor Suit Slams!

In the Monday-Tuesday Morning Compact Knockout Teams this hand was a big swing. Minor suit slams are often large swings, because they are difficult to reach.

At one table, North passed, and South opened the bidding 2NT. 2NT opening bids are often called slam killers because they eat up so much bidding space and do not leave much room for Responder to show their shape without going past 3NT.

At one table the auction got off to a difficult start:

North	South
P	2NT

After partner's 2NT opening bid, North did not know if South had a great minor suit holding (as they do) and slam would be a good contract, or if South had lots of points in the Majors, the hand was a big misfit, and 3NT was going to take some work to make. Some partnerships use 3♠ or 4♠ as minor suit slam tries; without a gadget to help describe their hand, North faced a difficult decision and bid a practical and conservative 3NT.

My teammates had a gadget that helped them get to this slam in a much more practical way:

North	South
2NT*	6♦!

This 2NT* opening bid showed about 5-10 HCP (less than an opening hand) and at least 5-5 in the minor suits. South, having a great hand with excellent fitting honors in both minor suits, did not mess around and just bid a small slam. (He was actually worried about missing the grand slam if partner had 0-3-5-5 distribution.)

There are many conventions that are designed to help us deal with difficult minor suit hands (Minor-Suit Stayman, Inverted Minors, Minorwood, etc..) The fact that so much thought has been dedicated to constructing gadgets for these hands is a sign of their difficulty. Do not feel bad if you find bidding minor suit slams more difficult than Major suit ones.

Here is a hand from the defending champions of the Monday-Tuesday Evening Championship Pairs, Jeff Hand and Gail Greenberg. Many players may have Passed after hearing South open their 6-card ♣ suit. But Jeff overcalled 1NT and played it there!

North led the ♠3 after Jeff saw the dummy, he did the most important thing a Declarer can do, he spent some time thinking about the hand before playing off dummy at trick 1. Seeing the ♠3 Jeff deduced that North had a 4-card ♠ suit. Seeing that N/S have an 8-card ♥ he concluded that ♥ are likely 4-4. Assuming that North choose to lead their best suit, North is likely to have the ♠K. Jeff played the ♠Q at trick 1 and this held the trick.

Now he decided to take a ♦ finesse. He made a good play of leading the ♦T off the dummy, but South managed not to cover and Jeff quite reasonable chose to play the ♦Q. He now played a ♣ to the Ace and another ♣, setting up the ♣ suit. South did well to return a ♠, not shifting to a ♥ and setting up declarer's ♥K.

But Jeff had already bid well and make good decisions at trick 1 and 2 to take 9 tricks in 1NT and almost all the matchpoints!

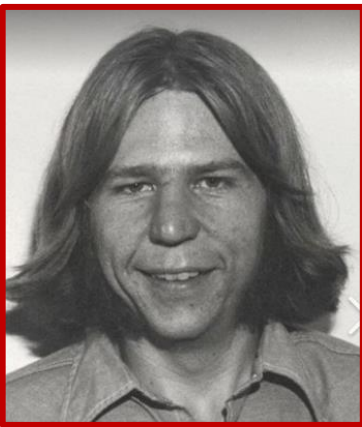

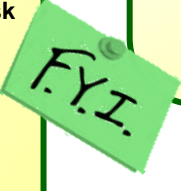
